Confidence in Chaos (Week 2) LifeNotes

Main Idea

Since I am safest in the security of Jesus, I can have confidence, even in chaotic times.

Key Scriptures

Are they Hebrews? So am I. Are they Israelites? So am I. Are they offspring of Abraham? So am I. Are they servants of Christ? I am a better one—I am talking like a madman—with far greater labors, far more imprisonments, with countless beatings, and often near death.

Five times I received at the hands of the Jews the forty lashes less one. Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea; on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brothers; in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure.

- What's your greatest fear in life?

Start doing.

- What would it look like for you to leverage your privilege and power for others in the coming weeks?
- How is God calling you to sacrifice your life for the sake of others?
