TALK IT OVER

Main Idea

Divorce shatters the image of God's faithfulness and wholeness. Yet, God's faithfulness redeems our past, ignites our present, and restores our future.

Key Scriptures

Some Pharisees came and tested him by asking, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" "What did Moses command you?" he replied. They said, "Moses permitted a man to write a certificate of divorce and send her away." "It was because your hearts were hard that Moses wrote you this law," Jesus replied. "But at the beginning of creation God 'made them male and female.' 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate." Mark 10:6-9

Key Ideas

Start talking.

- How has the view of divorce changed from 50 years ago?
- What are the positives and negatives of that change?
- Why do you think the divorce rates among Christians are essentially the same as non-Christians?

Start thinking.

- Read Mark 10:6-9. Why did Jesus say Moses allowed divorce?
- What is meant by, "your hearts were hard"?
- Read through the 4 Key Ideas. Why does it matter that marriage is God's idea?
- How is divorce a breaking of God's image?
- How can a healthy marriage represent God's nature and character?
- Read the Lamentations, Deuteronomy, and Psalms passages. What do they say about God's faithfulness?
- Read the Romans 8 passage. How does that connect to those who have experienced divorce?

Start doing.

- If you are married, how can your marriage better be a reflection to others of God's faithfulness?
- If you are single, how can you support the married couples around you?
- If you have experienced divorce, take this week to memorize Romans 8:1;38-39 and receive God's faithful love.
