Main Idea

Our true life comes into focus when we look through the eyes of a LION.

Key Scriptures

For now we see through a mirror, darkly... 1 Corinthians 13:12

Stop weeping; behold, the Lion that is from the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has overcome... Revelation 5:5

We are ill equipped to navigate darkness.

Details hidden in plain sight:

1. He is always a better savior than you are a sinner.
Romans 8:1-2
2. You were bought with an infinite price for a glorious purpose. Romans 6:4
3. Celebrate in the light the battle that was won in the dark.
Acts 8:36

Awareness of the invisible sets us up to do the impossible. – Levi Lusko

Start talking.

- Describe a time growing up when you were afraid of the dark.
- What about the dark is often unsettling?
- How would having better vision in the dark be a benefit?

Start thinking.

- Read 1 Corinthians 13:12. In what ways is our vision currently limited? How does that impact everyday life?
- Read Revelation 5:5. Why is Jesus referred to as a “Lion”? How does that metaphor affect your understanding of Jesus?
- Read Psalm 119:18. What “miracle-wonders” might we be missing if our eyes have not been opened by God?

Start sharing.

- How are the three details Joel mentioned, hidden in plain sight?
- Why are those three so important to keep in focus?
- Which of the three is easiest for you to lose sight of?

Start doing.

- Memorizing scripture is one of the simplest and most powerful tools we have to help us see through the eyes of Jesus. Commit to memorize Psalm 119:18 and to make it a prayer throughout your week.
