Main Idea

In His way is our highway home.

Key Scriptures

Jesus told him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me." John 14:6 NLT

For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 6:23 NLT

Start talking.

Start thinking.

- Read John 14:6. How can we "miss the forest for the trees" by just focusing on the second sentence?
- What questions/objections do we and/or culture bring up in response to this verse?
- How do those questions/objections miss the point of Jesus' statement?
- Read Romans 6:23. How can the first part of that verse obscure the overall point Paul was making?
- What is the bottom line truth of both these verses?

Start sharing.

- How does Jesus being: the way, the truth, the life connect for you?
- How do those statements meet you where you are?

Start doing.
