## **Main Ideas**

Father God is a home offering hope and help for all who are hurting.

## **Key Scriptures**

Tax collectors and other notorious sinners often came to listen to Jesus teach. This made the Pharisees and teachers of religious law complain that he was associating with such sinful people—even eating with them!
Luke 15:1-2

To illustrate the point further, Jesus told them this story: "A man had two sons... Luke 15:11

So he returned home to his father. And while he was still a long way off, his father saw him coming. Filled with love and compassion, he ran to his son, embraced him, and kissed him. Luke 15:20

The Lord you God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing.

- Read Luke 15:20. How is this verse a culmination of all three stories?
- Read Zephaniah 3:17. How does this verse fit with the father in the parable?
- Read Proverbs 11:25. How does helping others benefit the helper?
- Read Psalm 71:14. How did the father demonstrate hope?
- Read Luke 15:22-24. Why throw such a celebration?

# Start sharing.

- How does the parable of the lost son speak to you about God's character?
- How have you seen helping others lead to greater healing?
- How can a parent balance healthy boundaries with never giving up hope?
- How does God continue to pursue us in spite of ourselves?

#### Start doing.

- What aspect of God's character will you choose to focus and believe in this week?
- Who will you help in their journey of healing?
- What will you celebrate in another this week?
