# TALK IT OVER

#### Main Idea

As a follower of Jesus—a Christian, the Holy Bible is our trustworthy authority for faith and practice.

#### **Key Scriptures**

Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, he explained to them the things concerning himself in all the Scriptures...Now he said to them, "These are my words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled."

- Read through the Key Scriptures. How did Jesus feel about the Scriptures?
- Why does it matter that Jesus anticipated and authenticated the New Testament?

#### Start sharing.

- Read Hebrews 4:12. How has Scripture been "alive and active" in your or someone else's life?
- What have been personal obstacles to developing a consistent discipline of reading the Bible?
- What can we expect from developing a daily discipline of Scripture reading?

#### Start doing.

- If you haven't already, download the YouVersion Bible App. https://www.youversion.com
- Commit to beginning each day in January with at least the "Verse of the Day".
- If you prefer a traditional Bible, then commit to reading daily for the month of January. Great places to start are choosing the chapter in Proverbs that corresponds to the date and/or to begin reading through the Gospel of John.
