# So Much More

More Than a Holiday (Week 1) LifeNotes



#### Main Idea

Christmas is the promise we can expect so much more than we could hope or imagine.

#### Key Scriptures

And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" Luke 2:8-14

## Start thinking.

- Read Luke 2:8-14. What did the shepherds expect their night to look like? Why did they end up leaving their sheep? How might that experience have impacted the rest of their lives?
- Read John 1:14. Where was Jesus before he made his "home among us"? Why didn't he remain in heaven?
  What motivated Jesus to become human and draw close to all of us?
- Read Ephesians 3:20-21. How does this connect to our expectations during Christmas?

# Start sharing.

What keeps you from expecting much from Jesus?

- Pastor Joel mentioned we can expect Jesus to love us, bless us, and be with us. Which connects closest with you?
- Why does this matter for you during this Christmas season?

## Start doing.

 Receive it. Whether it is your first time to believe in Jesus as Lord or not. How might this Christmas be different if you daily chose to remind yourself of all you have received from Jesus?

 Rest in it. Stop striving and working so hard to try and earn what has already been freely given. What will you do this Christmas to rest in the peace that Jesus promises you?
