Main Idea

When we have a goal worth doing anything for, we will do whatever it takes.

Key Scriptures

Some men came, bringing to him a paralytic, carried by four of them. Since they could not get him to Jesus because of the crowd, they made an opening in the roof above Jesus and, after digging through it, lowered the mat the paralyzed the man was lying on. Mark 2:3-4

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. 2 Corinthians 1:3-4

Start talking.

- What have been some goals that required you to make significant changes to attain?

Start thinking.

- Read Mark 2:3-4. What was the clearly defined goal for the friends? How did the specificity of the goal help them overcome obstacles?
- Read Psalm 34:18. How can you and the church better create an environment where we welcome home heartbroken and hurting people?
- Read Ephesians 4:1; 2:10. What is a "calling"? How can the church equip and launch people in the calling?
- Read James 2:14-17. Why is it important for us the make our faith in Jesus tangible?

Start sharing.

- How has Jesus and/or the church "welcomed you home" when you have been hurting?
- What "work" has God called you to? If you don't know, how can you find out?
- How have you seen others make their faith tangible?
- What are different ways the church can make Jesus tangible in our community?

Start doing.

- If you know what God has called you to do, pray for Him to give you the ongoing
 courage to keeping moving forward in faith. If you're not sure, commit to pray daily
 that God would reveal it to you.
