#### Main Idea

Relationships succeed when we rejoice in truth together.

## **Key Scriptures**

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 NIV

## Key take always:

- Individual joy at other's expense is wrong and is no joy at all.
- True love rejoices in truth together.

#### Start talking.

- Pastor Joel made the statement: "We cannot be both loving and distracted." How is that true?
- What things fight for your "relational" focus?

#### Start thinking.

- Read 1 John 4:7-8. How does love come from God?
- Why is it impossible to know God without knowing love?
- John says, "God is love." Why is that important? How does the concept of the Trinity reflect this?
- Read 1 Corinthians 13:4-7. What is the key difference between "delight" and "rejoice"? Explain why that is important.
- When referring to delight and evil Pastor Joel said, "The two together are about living a lifestyle of self-gratification at the expense of another." What are some examples?
- How does the relationship in the Trinity reflect rejoicing in truth?

## Start sharing.

- How have you settled for "delight" vs. "rejoicing"?
- What are "true" experiences that result in rejoicing?

# Start doing.

 What "truth" (either objectively or subjectively) can you rejoice and celebrate with someone this week?
