Main Idea

The local church is the Bride and Body of Christ.

Now I say to you that you are Peter (which means 'rock'), and upon this rock I will build my church, and all the powers of hell will not conquer it. Matthew 16:18 NLT

- Read Matthew 16:18. This is the first use of the term, "church" in the New Testament. What can be interpreted from the five words, "I will build my church"? Why is that phrase so important?
- Read Ephesians 5:25-27. What do they tell us about Christ's special relationship with the church? How should that impact our view of church?
- Read 1 Corinthians 12:12, 27. How is the "body" metaphor informative to our understanding of church?

Start sharing.

- Read the list of values under both the Bride and Body of Christ sections. Describe circumstances you seen them to be true and where they have failed.
- Why is it important to critically evaluate the harm caused by a church and the harm caused by individuals within the church?
- Why should someone who has been hurt by the church or those within the church choose to be a part of it?

Start doing.

- How can understanding the special status of the local church as both the Bride and Body of Christ impact your relationship with it?
- Would you pray about joining Harbor as we faithfully respond to God's leading to build our capacity as a church to care for one life at a time?
